City of Willcox Budget Process FY 2010-2011

Willcox is preparing its Fiscal Year 2010-2011 (FY11) budget. There are many challenges this year because of the overall economic downturn and the State of Arizona's serious budget challenges. The State just passed its FY10 budget on March 11th at about 75% of the way through the fiscal year.

General Fund revenues this year are about 10% below expectations. Our City Sales Tax percentage of collections has not declined as much as it has in other communities, but the decline will impact City services. To keep costs down the City has four unfilled job positions, with one each in Public Safety dispatch, Streets, Development Services, and Public Works Administration. That represents about 5% of our workforce. While the wet winter has been hard on our streets, the Streets Department revenues are one of the areas hardest hit by reductions. Streets receives its funding from HURF (the Highway User Revenue Fund), LTAF (Local Transportation Assistance Fund) funded by the State Lottery, and the 1% City sales tax. HURF revenues have been declining for several years while prices have been increasing. The City's HURF revenues for FY09 were 18% lower than FY06, while FY10 revenues are projected to be lower yet. Current year distributions of LTAF funds were pulled mid-year by the State. We received 50% of the \$17,030 budgeted for the current year, and will budget no LTAF revenues for the upcoming year.

The City Council is carefully considering the FY11 budget. Difficult decisions will be made and public input is requested. For the months of April and May, budget work sessions are tentatively planned prior to the regular Council meetings on the first and third Monday of each month. We encourage citizens to attend the work sessions and the meetings to provide their input. City Primary Election Results Are In!

Following are the results from the City of Willcox Primary Election held on March 9, 2010. There were four (4) seats available and six (6) candidates (originally had seven (7) and one candidate removed himself). Terms are for four (4) years. There are 1,628 Registered Voters in the City. Ballots Processed were 249 (either came to vote at the polling place or voted Early Ballot) of which five (5) were Provisional Ballots and only one (1) Ballot was rejected (not a registered voter). The Certification of Canvass of the

Primary Election: Monika Cronberg-179; William "Bill" Holloway-145; Robert A. "Bob" Irvin-138; and Gerald "Sam" Lindsey-163; Jimmy L. Norris-41 (withdrew); Larry Schultz-82; and Paul Sheats-88. There were three (3) Write-In votes although officially there was no one eligible. Certificates of Election were issued to Cronberg, Holloway, Irvin and Lindsey. The Oath of Office will be administered the latter part of May and the first regular meeting is on June 7, 2010.
