MORE LIBRARY CHANGES COMING SOON!

Due to space limitations last month, my article on proper Library etiquette was incomplete. Here are a couple more areas I need to address, and ask for the public's support and cooperation:

- 1. PLEASE Help us keep the Library CLEAN, by picking up after yourself, especially those slips of paper for computer reservations. We have waste baskets positioned at each end of the computer workstation rows, in all three areas. We just had all of our carpets cleaned in mid-August. We ask that you wipe your feet at the door, on our door mats, not on our chair rollers. The Library is yours; it's a gathering place like the living room in your home only with a lot more guests visiting (131/day, 6 days/wk, on average). You don't want your guests trashing your living room, do you? There are fewer of us "housekeepers" here now to maintain the Library. We want everyone to have a safe, wonderful, pleasant experience! Please help us.
- **2.** Before, I did not specifically mention FOOD AND DRINKS in the Library. Ever since we implemented a Teen Program five years ago, to encourage that age group to come back and use the Library, we started to allow it, *in certain designated areas and times*. That philosophy has worked pretty well so far, **but around computers**, in **all** age groups, is where I must draw the line. Most people ARE responsible, and are careful, but as we all know from experience, there is that other 10% that could care less, or are just plain careless. We cannot afford to replace any of our computers. I am hoping/praying that none of our Library computers break down this year...

With the possible future addition of a Solarium Room and accompanying Coffee Bar, and the addition of a snack and soda vending machine in the Vestibule, we are going to allow

food and drink in a couple of areas of the Library — *Designated Areas* - like the *Solarium Room* primarily, and the *Booth seating area* of the Teen Room. We must reiterate "**No Food or Drink allowed near** *Library-owned* **computers!**" and enforce that rule. There will be signage posted in those areas, probably on the four power/data link poles. You may also bring in your own computers and use our Wi-Fi network. We encourage that.

Looking down the road a bit, I want people to be able to brown-bag their lunch here in the new Solarium Room or outside in the Patio Area, use the "Internet café" (Wi-Fi), and relax and enjoy themselves. Our goal is to be "the Gathering Place" here in the Community. Other good things like more activities and special programs or classes will soon follow. We are co-op'ing with the new Senior Center to complement their programs and activities, so please stay tuned! I have been asked to represent the City as a member of the Senior Center Advisory Committee, and in memory of Mrs. Rose C. Allan, I have accepted. We also have public meeting rooms now, so different classes and special programs will be happening in them from time to time. We are pretty well set up now for computer training in the big meeting room, with the addition of power and data connections in there, so it is logical to expect that *that* will be one area focused on by the community, local businesses, and educational institutions. We are on our way folks, to making this the BEST little Library in all of Southeast AZ! Thank you for your patronage, support and cooperation.
