Recycle' Your Used Christmas Tree!

When you are finished with your Christmas tree (assuming you did not buy a live tree for replanting or have a reusable tree) you may disposal of the *undecorated* tree by taking it to the City's "Green Site". The Green Site is located near the Golf Course; take Rex Allen **Jr.** Drive toward the Golf course; just before the Driving Range, turn right on the dirt road; about a ¼ mile on the left is a large area for green waste (not for garbage, old sofas, concrete, or lumber). If you leave your *undecorated* tree there, the City will mulch it up. The mulch is free to anyone who would like to pick it up and use it.

If you have a hard time getting to the Green Site, **for Christmas only**, you can drop off your used Christmas tree across the street from the Public Works yard on the railroad frontage at Delos and Railroad Ave. Please have a Safe and Happy Holidays.

'Tis The Season To Give Safe Gifts

Keep your kids **S.A.F.E**. These tips cover toy safety from purchase to play.

S = Supervision:

Watch young children closely as they play—if you're not playing with them yourselves. Teach children how to use their toys safely.

Teach older children to keep their toys away from younger siblings.

Inspect kids' toys regularly. Fix broken toys immediately or throw them out.

A = Age appropriate:

Choose toys that are developmentally appropriate and suit the age, ability, and interest level of

vour child.

Read labels on toys or containers to guide you in choosing safe items.

F = Free of inherent hazards:

Toys for children under the age of 3 should be free of small parts, sharp points and edges, and

long cords.

Look for labels with warnings, such as: "NOT RECOMMENDED FOR CHILDREN UNDER

THREE. CONTAINS SMALL PARTS."

E = **Equipment**:

Require kids to wear helmets when using bicycles, skateboards, or in-line roller blades. Wear them yourselves when sharing these activities with kids.

Require kids to wear gloves, wrist, elbow, and knee pads when using skateboards or in-line roller

blades.

Why It Matters:

Over 3 billion toys and games are sold every year in the U.S.

Around 15 children under the age of 14 die from a toy-related incident every year.

Around 217,000 toy-related injuries are treated in hospital emergency rooms.

In one recent year, 20 children died from toy-related deaths. In the same year, there were 75,000 toy-related injures in children under the age of 14.

The Willcox Fire Department Wishes Everyone A Safe And Happy Holiday Season And Offers These Fire Safety Tips:

First and foremost, make sure you have a working smoke detector. Ensure the battery is fresh and the detector is working. (If you don't have one, the Willcox Fire Dept. still has some smoke detectors that we can provide you for free after you fill out a small application form). Contact the Fire Dept. for info at 384-4673.

Turkey Fryers are a major cause of residential fires and burn injuries during the Holiday Season.

Here are some tips for safe use:

- Keep the fryer in FULL VIEW while the burner is on. Never leave it unattended.
- Place fryer in an open area AWAY from all walls, fences and other structures.
- Never use IN, ON, or UNDER a garage, breezeway, carport, or porch.
- Raise and lower food SLOWLY to reduce splatter and avoid burns.
- COVER bare skin when adding or removing food from the fryer.
- Check the oil temperature often. If oil begins to smoke, immediately turn the unit OFF.
- Never place a wet, frozen, or partially frozen turkey into a fryer.
- Partially frozen, frozen and/or wet turkeys can produce excessive hot oil splatter and could cause a fire.
- Do not overfill the fryer with oil, doing so could cause the oil to overflow when adding food and cause a fire.
- If a fire does occur, IMMEDIATELY call 911. DO NOT attempt to put out the fire yourself!!
