#### JUST A SMALL EFFORT CAN HELP PROTECT YOUR PROPERTY

How many bicycles do you have at your home? Are they secure? If any of them were stolen from your yard tonight, would you be able to tell police the brand, model, and serial number of your bikes?

While the number of bicycles stolen in Willcox goes up and down, the recovery rate tends to stay at about fifty percent. If the owner of a bicycle can provide police with the serial number, the bike can be entered into the FBI's nationwide database, which increases the chances of us recovering it. Without the serial number, proving ownership is difficult, even if we do recover a bicycle that matches the description of one that is stolen.

Please take time to record the brand name and model of the bicycles you own, and especially the serial number, which can usually be found under the frame between the pedals. Photographs assist police greatly in searching for your missing property. The Willcox Police Department can also "register" your bikes with our department, free of charge. When requested, we will photograph and record your serial numbers and other identifying characteristics on file cards that stay within the department until needed.

Of course, locking the bicycle up or storing it in a secure building decreases your chances of becoming a victim as well.

#### Willcox Residents Love Their Library!

Folks, I am very happy to report the results of the Library's annual Customer Satisfaction Survey to you. We distributed 75 surveys during January and February this year, and 67 were completed and returned. That was great (90%)! What was probably more significant, was that we received about 190 comments from those 67 people. The four most significant highlights of the survey results are: (1) Staff received the highest marks (99%) for being very helpful, courteous and professional, and for making our patrons feel welcome in the Library; (2) 94% indicated that we are fulfilling their needs for informational and leisure materials, which speaks very well about the quality and quantity of our services and resources. We are always mindful that there is always room for improvement, and we will strive to achieve it; (3) 94% also indicated that they like the improvements we have made in the Library, especially the interior atmosphere/environment; and (4) We had a 5-pt jump in percentage points with regard to our Children's programs, and 3 and 4% increases in Senior and Guest Speaker programs, respectively, so that tells us our programming is reaching the needs of more and more people. Come visit your local Library!

Here is just one of the comments we received this year: "Thank you for having a wonderful Library. Our family comes in at least once a week and our daughter gets to come twice a week. The employees are wonderful that work here. They are always friendly and helpful. They have helped us in many ways. We lived in Tucson and went there, but this one is better in every way. Thanks for being here for all of us. Keep up the good work!"
