As we move forward into a brand new fiscal year, we unfortunately find ourselves faced with a situation today where it will be difficult to assess what direction our community wants their newly-renovated Library to go. You may ask yourself, "What can I do to help?" I will answer that in a moment. Yes — we did receive great feedback from the public on our annual Customer Satisfaction Survey, and yes, 15 members of the community came together recently to help us build a brand new five-year Strategic Plan for the Library. We sincerely thank all those folks that participated in those two events! But that is not what I am here to talk about today.

As the Director, I depend on input from members of the community, both City and County residents, to provide me with feedback, as well as having those members communicate factual information back to the rest of the community, concerning events and activities the Library is *currently* engaged in, as well as possible *future* events. We have advertised for many weeks to fill this vacant position as well as other Boards within the City, with **no** response. Advertising costs money, taxpayer money, and we want all of you to get the most bang for your buck. That is why I am speaking to you from this forum today. Apathy is about the worst thing that can happen to any community. Everything falls apart when nobody cares.

Folks, we have a *wonderful* community here, a community with tremendous heart, a community that comes together in times of crisis, pain and sorrow, as well as on joyous occasions. Someone once said, "You only get out of it what you put into it." That is so true! I urge you as citizens to *get involved* in your community, your local government, and with each other. Reach out and touch someone! Don't withdraw into your cell phones, tablets and computers, and become a vegetable, i.e., a couch potato. They are an aid, not an end-all.
